One very hot day, the traffic was bumper to bumper.

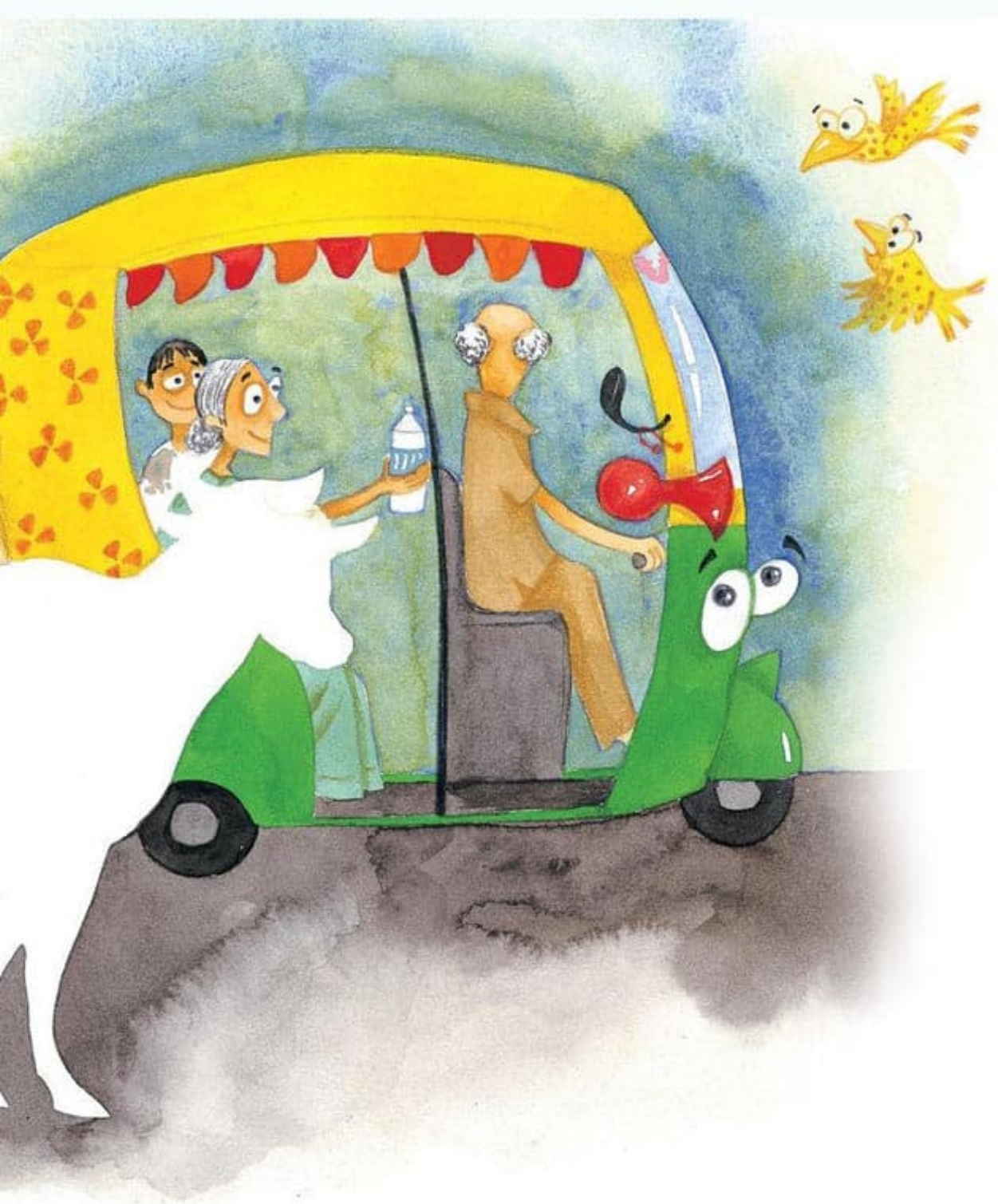
A grumpy old lady sat in the back, and she did not like to wait.

'They won't know where I am.'



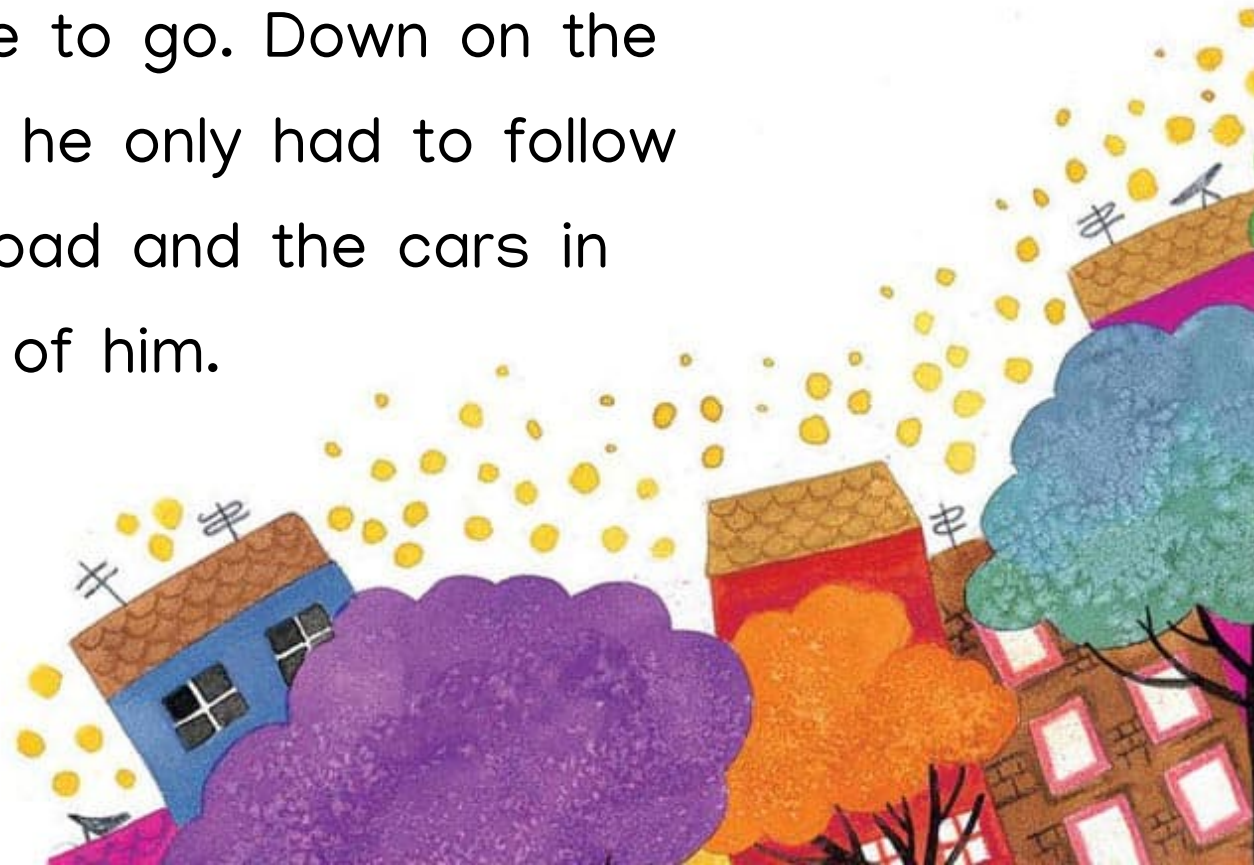
And Sir grew sad, too.

In the sky, he was not sure where to go. Down on the road, he only had to follow the road and the cars in front of him.



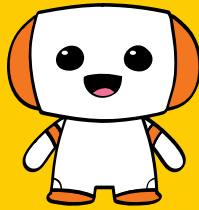
They landed, and the daughter of the lady was waiting.
