'Don't worry about it,' I say.

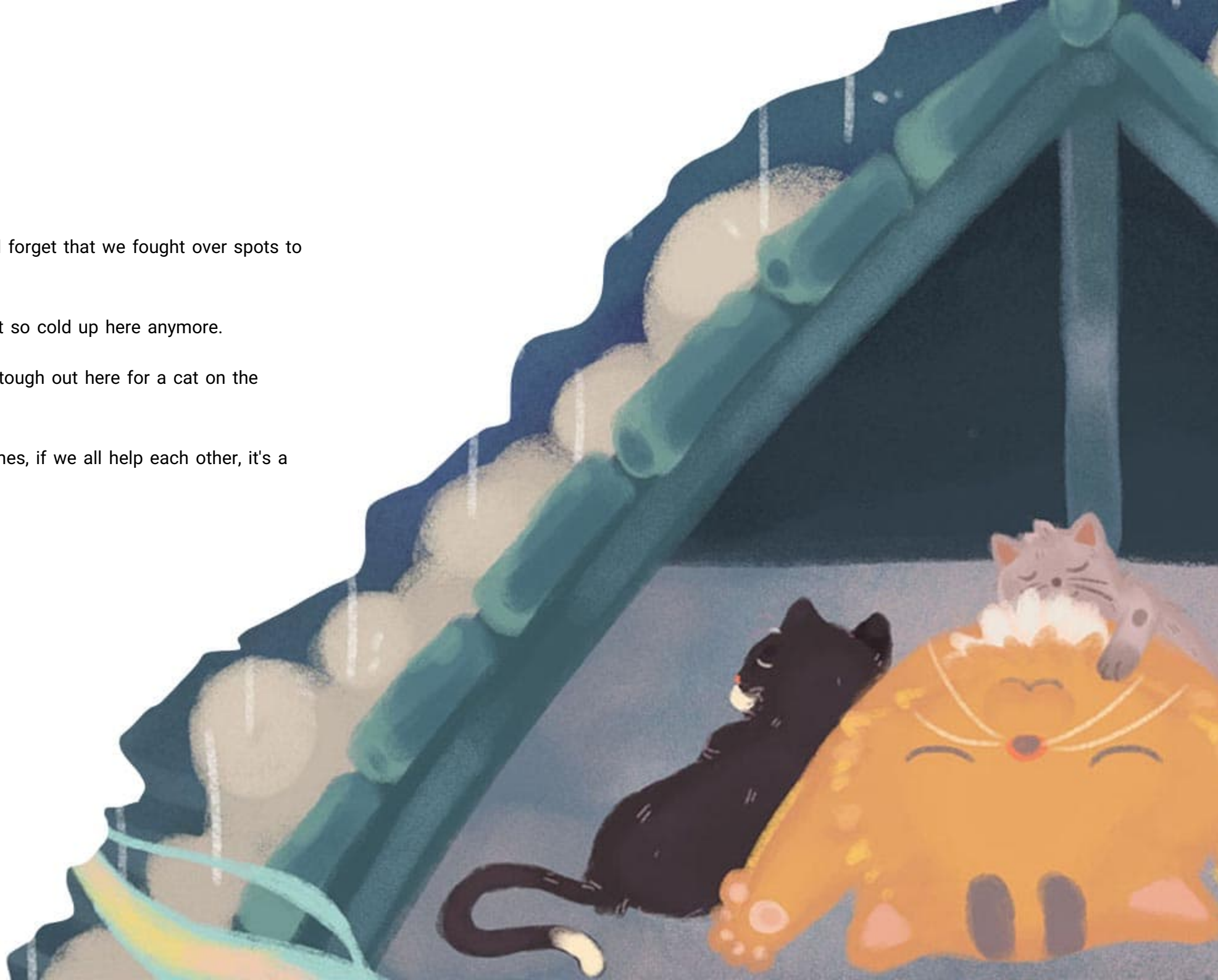


Soon, we all forget that we fought over spots to sleep in.
