Just then, a curious cat spots me bobbing in the air and pounces!



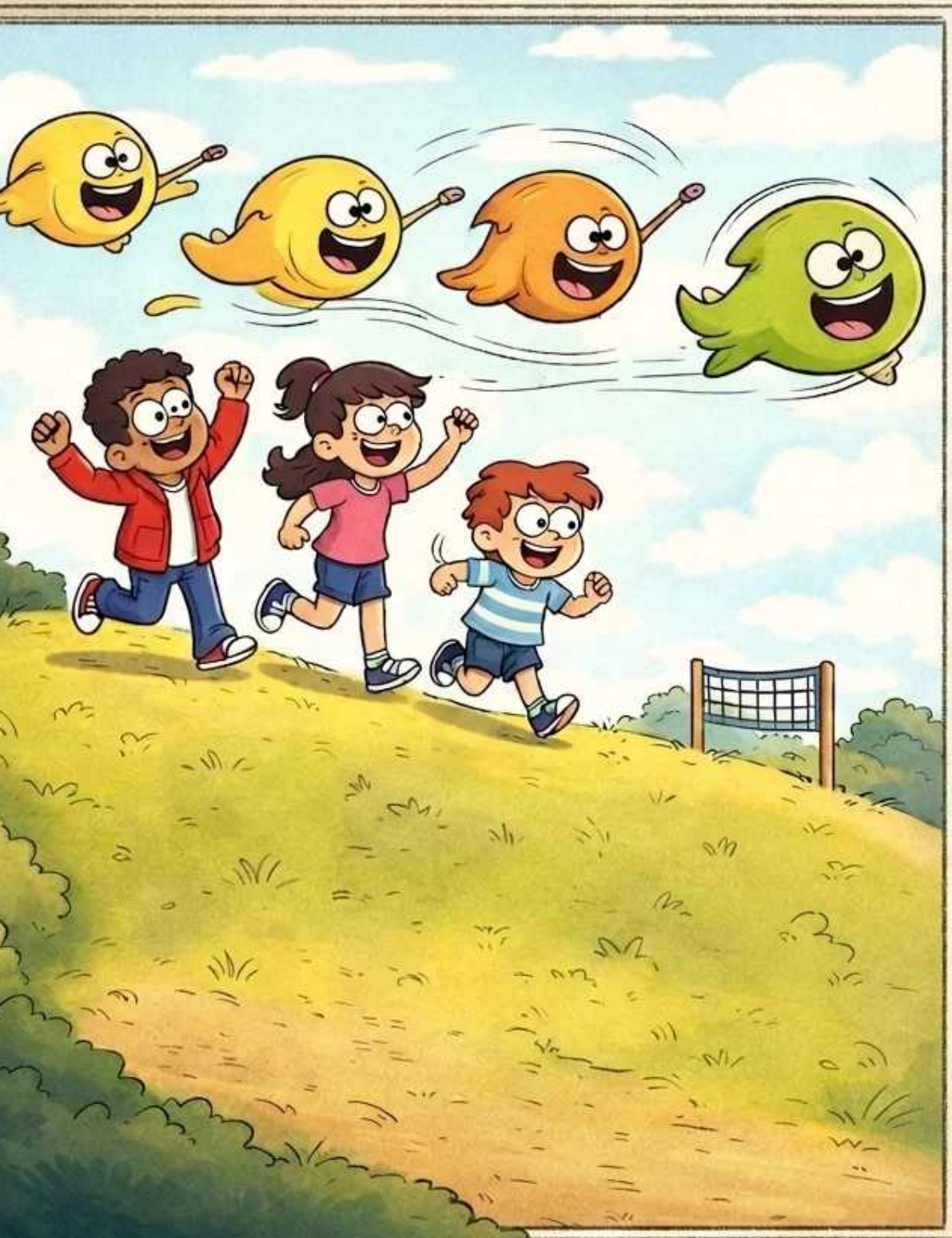
The cat tries to pop me, but I am more flexible than that!



It flops and jumps about while I make funny **ghostly** faces.

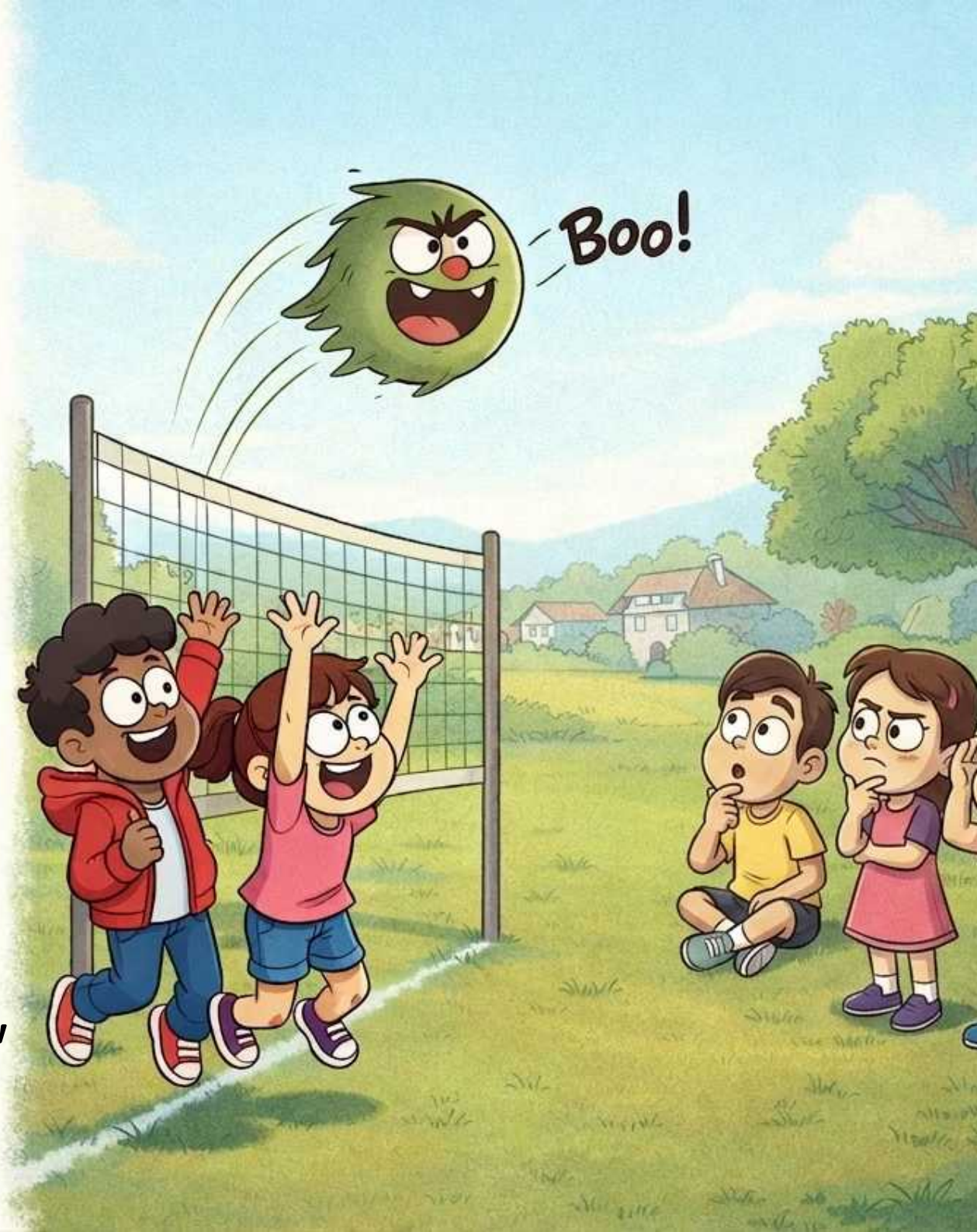
The kids start laughing!



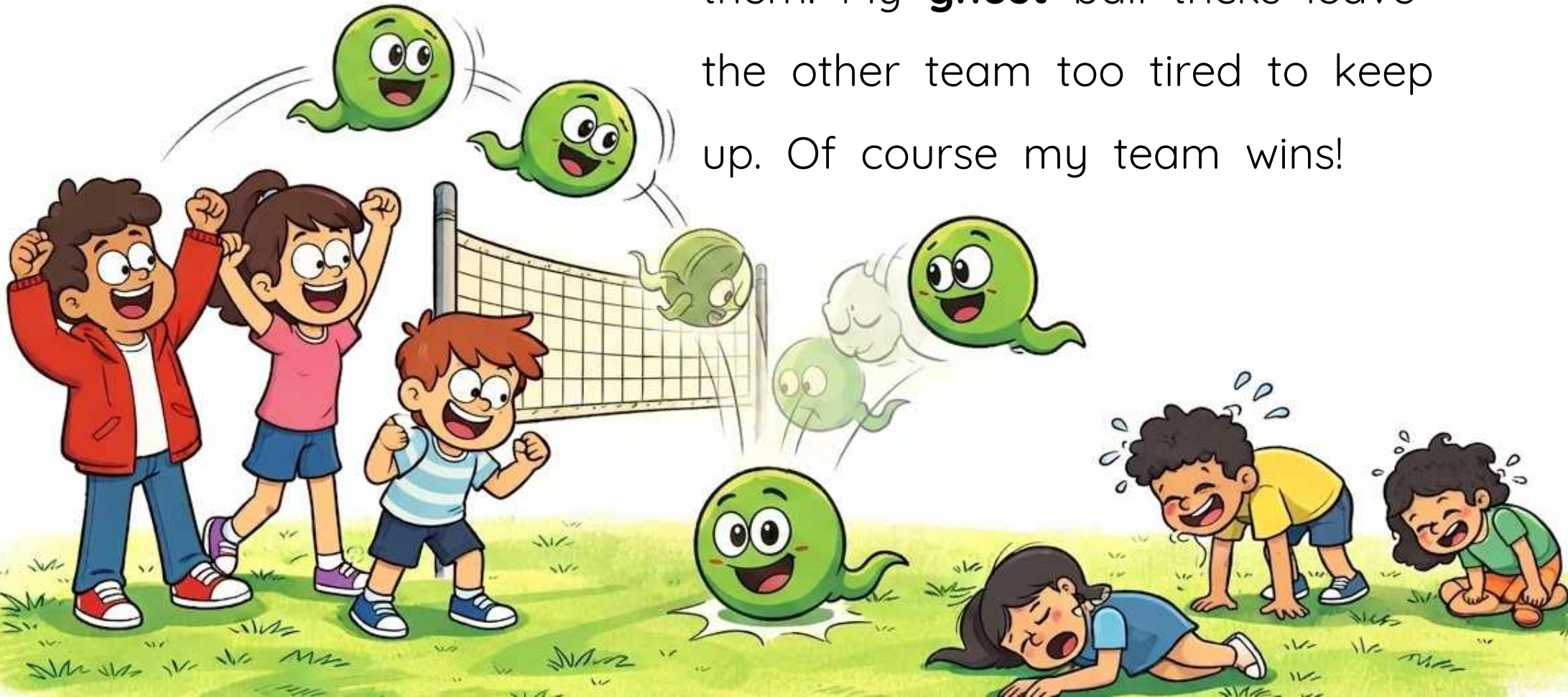

And I'm the ball! I can't wait until the other team finds out that I am a **ghost!** Well, here goes nothing. 'Boo!'



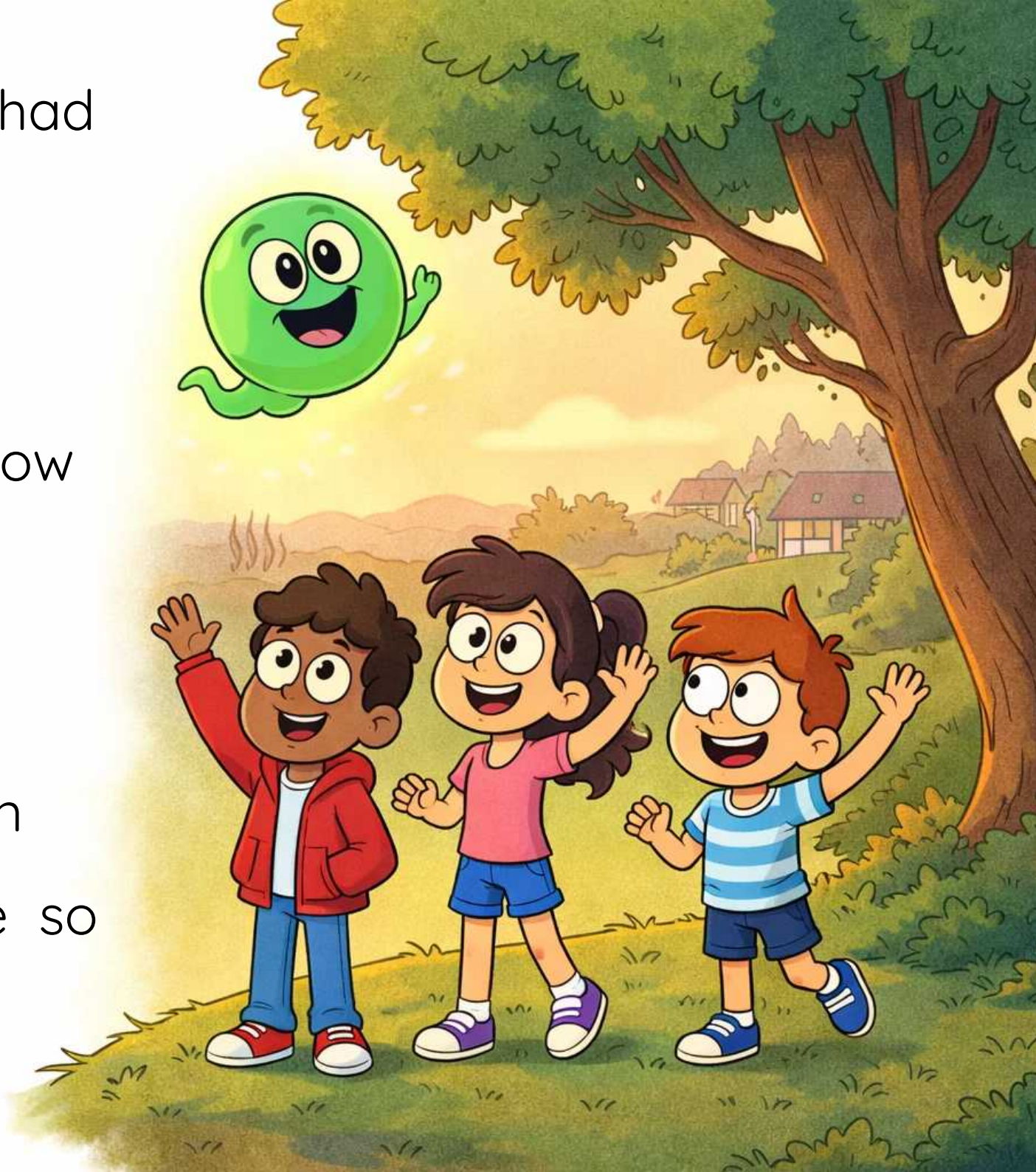
