He grabbed a shovel and **began** to dig. He could not carry the cactus home, but he could float it **over!**





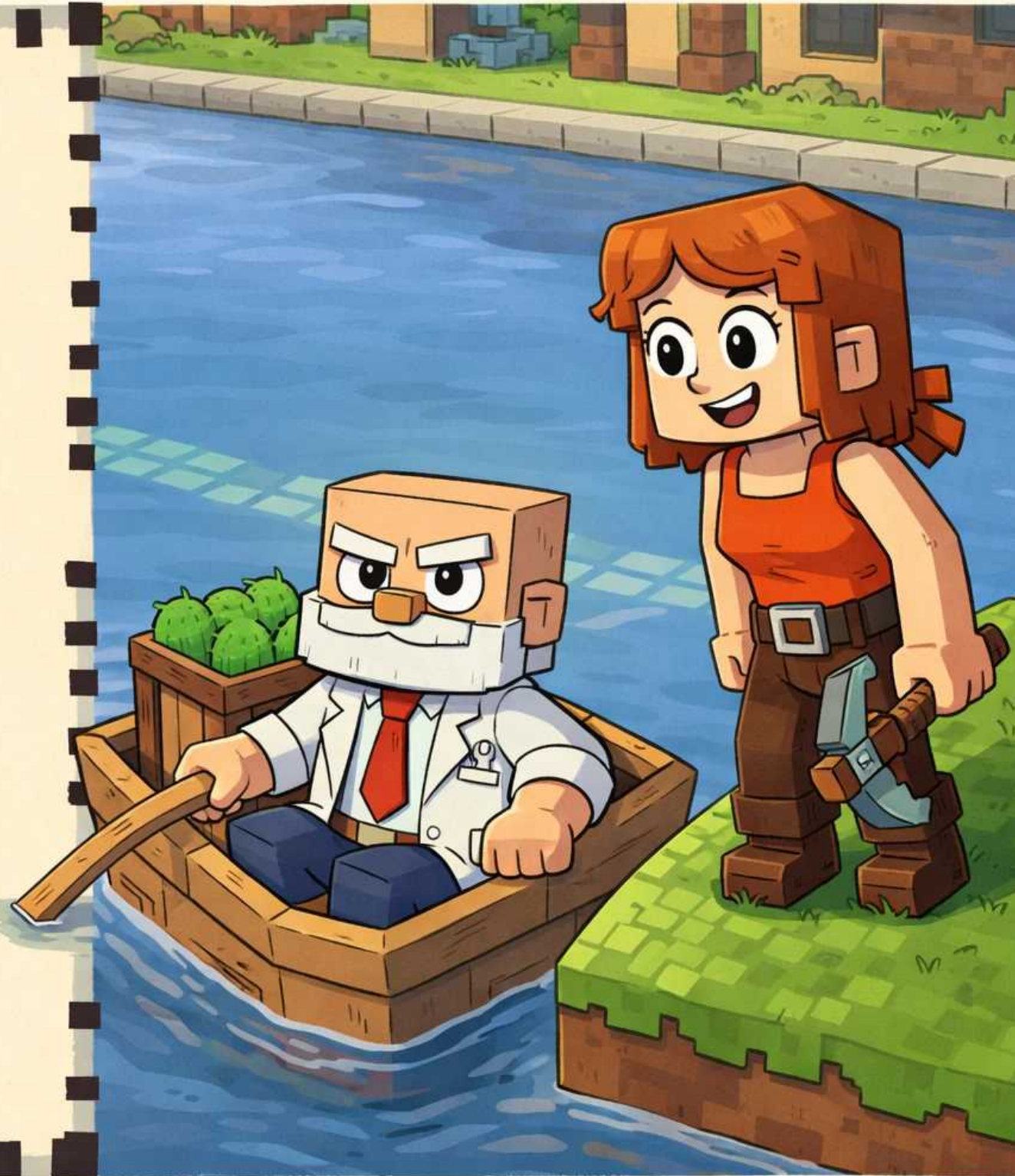
After three days, the canal went all the way to the desert. Dr Can Do filled it with **water** and set a boat with a chest at one end.
