Bones's belly growled. Skel's belly growled even louder.

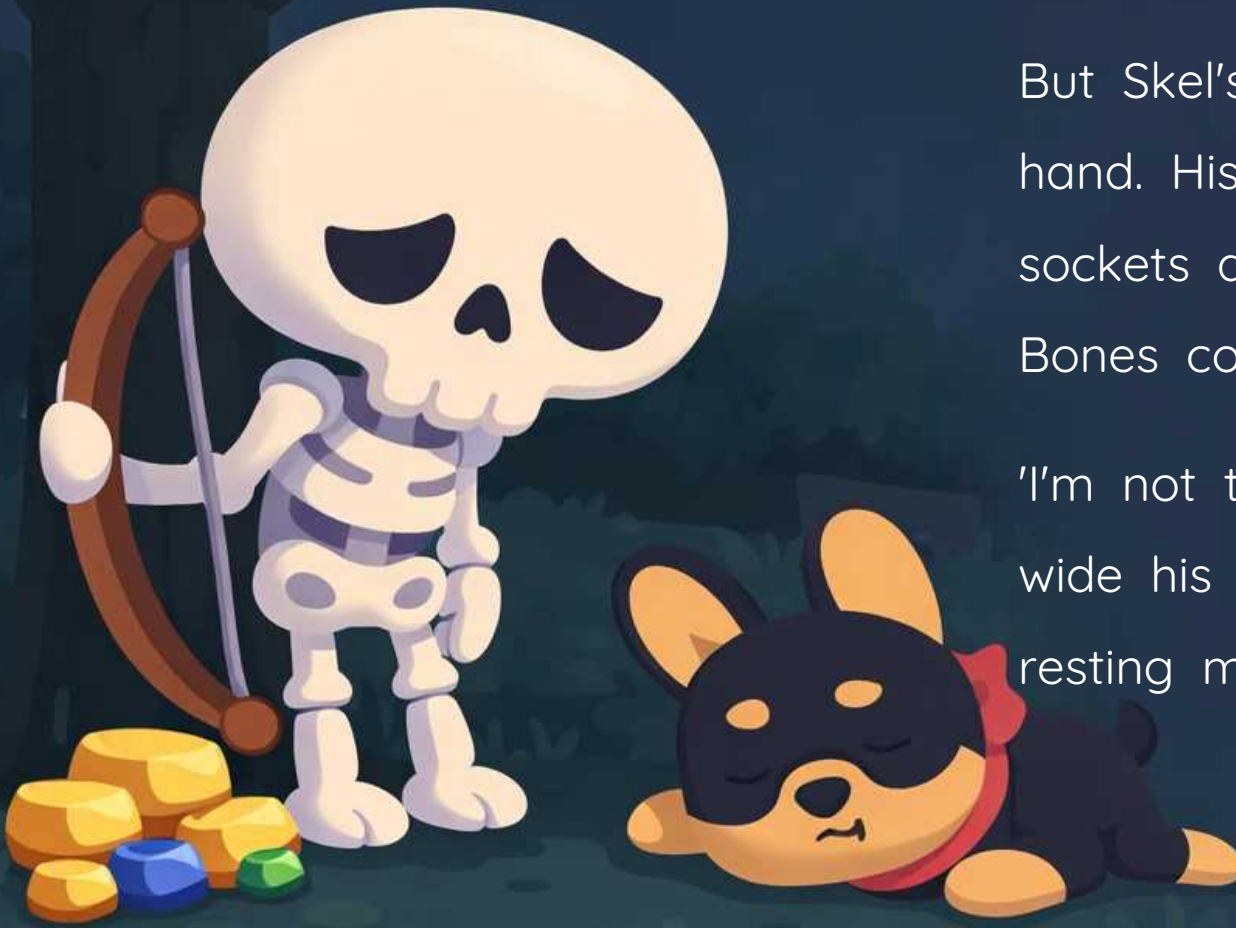
