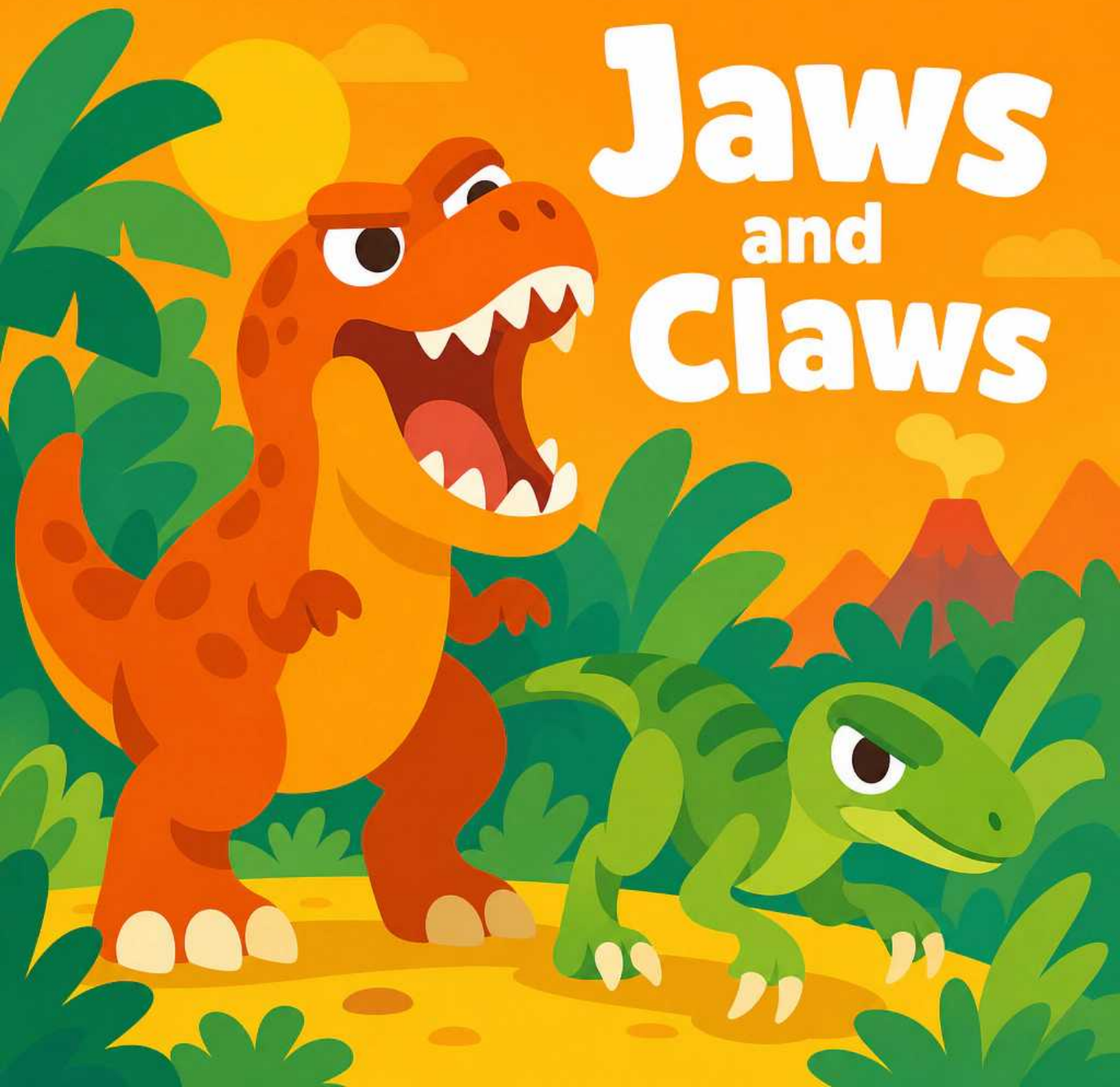


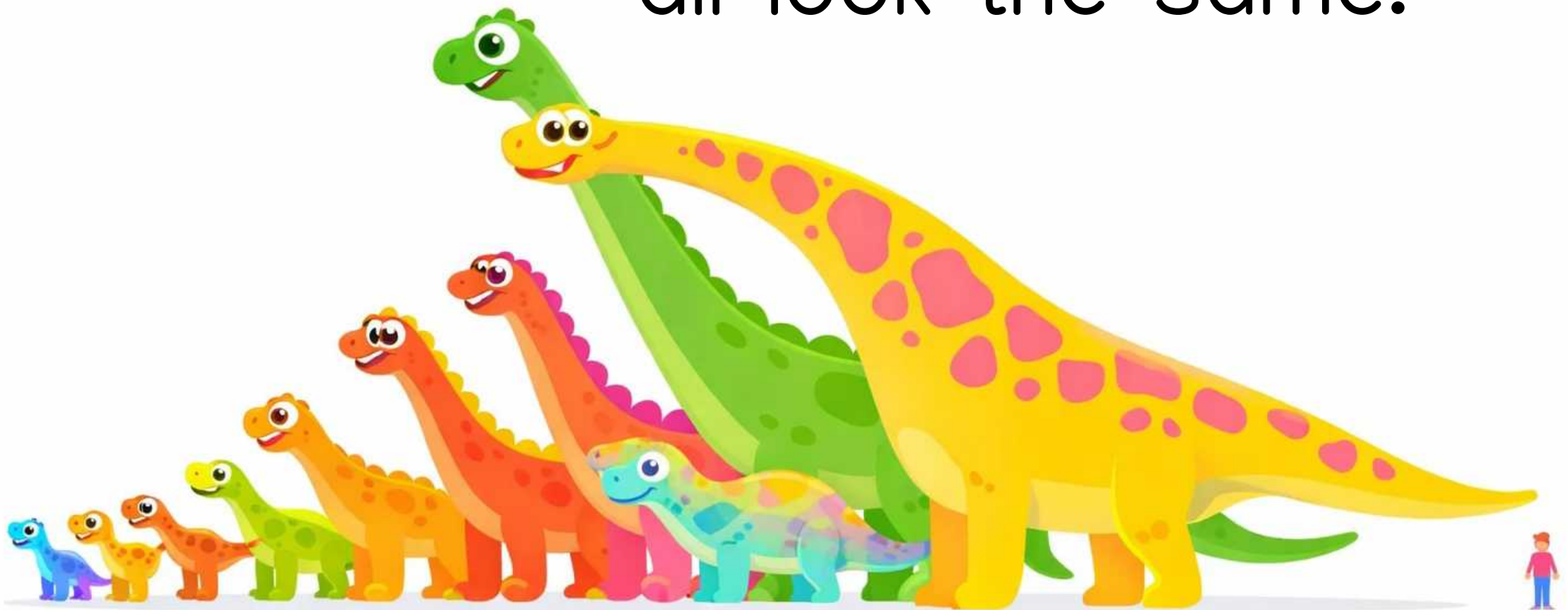
Jaws and Claws



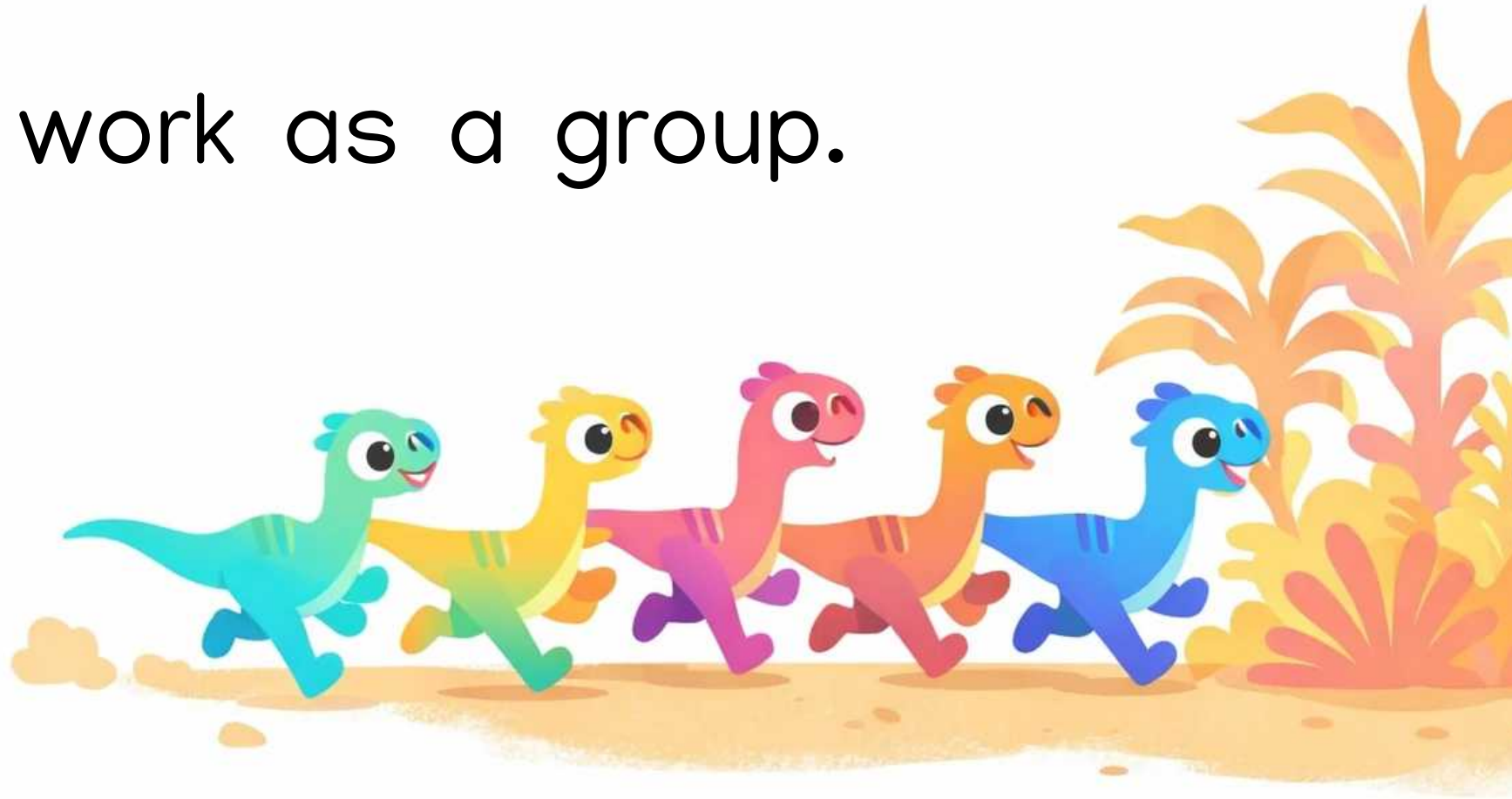
A loud roar!

day, like cows.

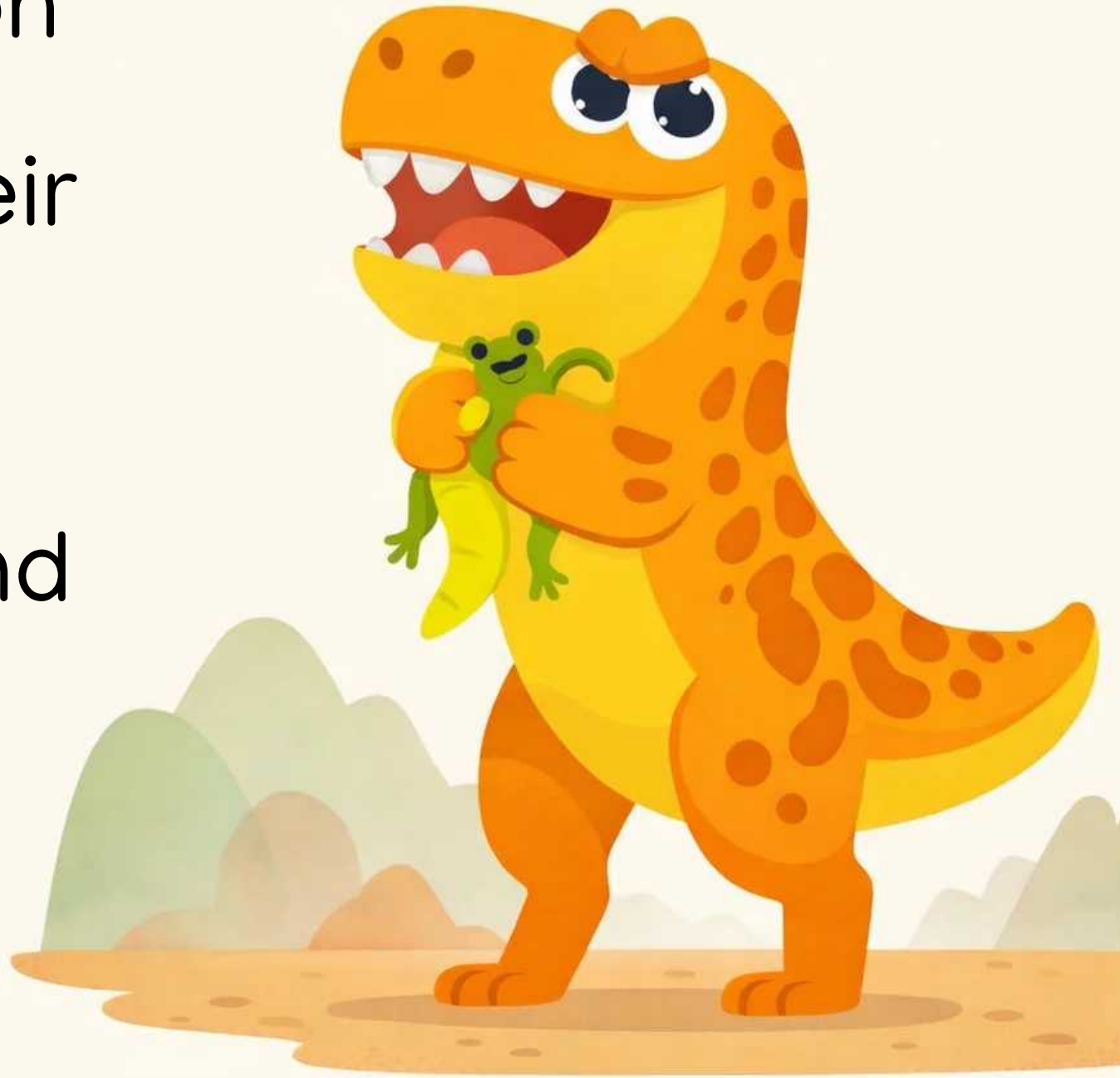
Some trotted
