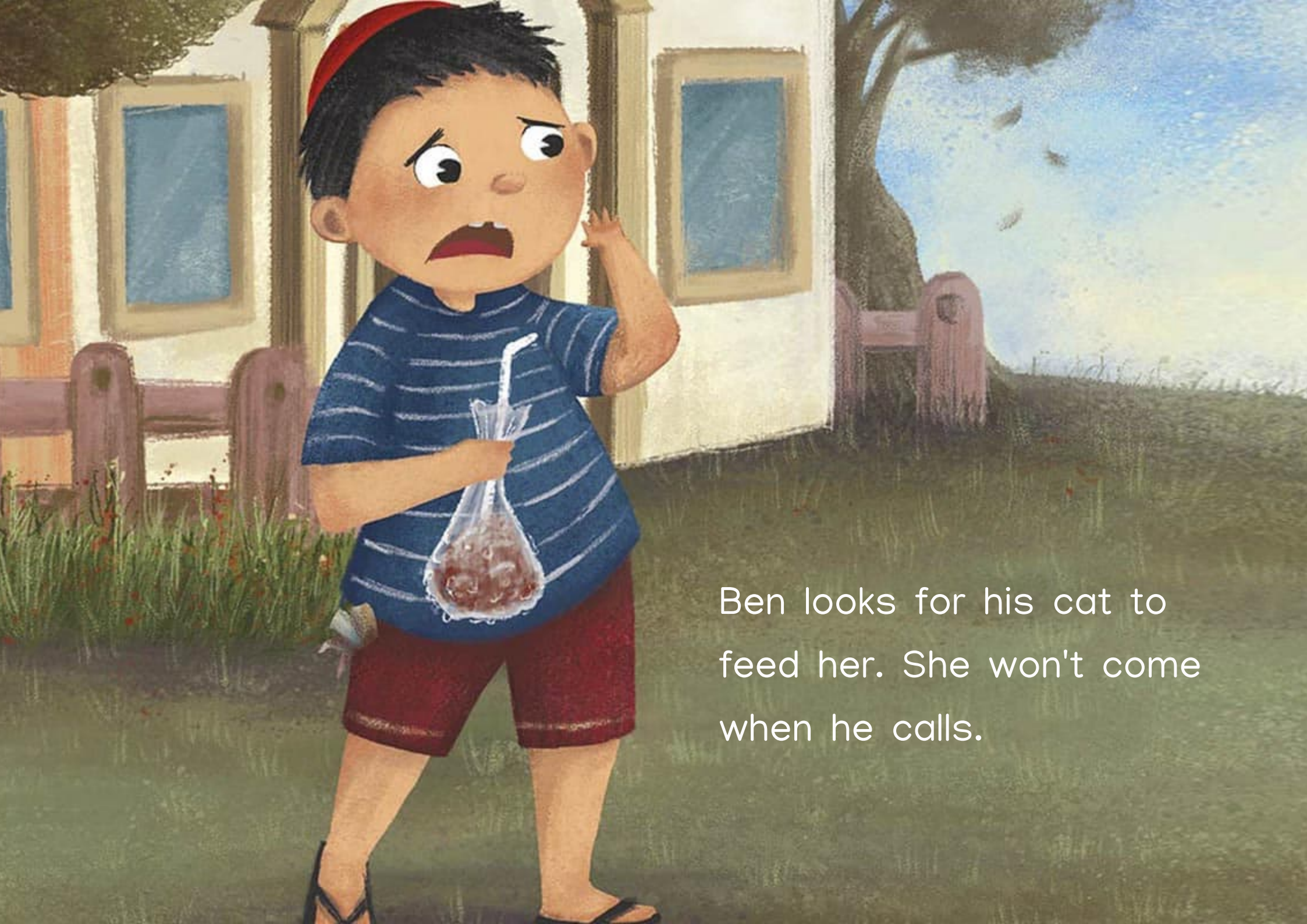


# Monster Pile

food,' says Ben.



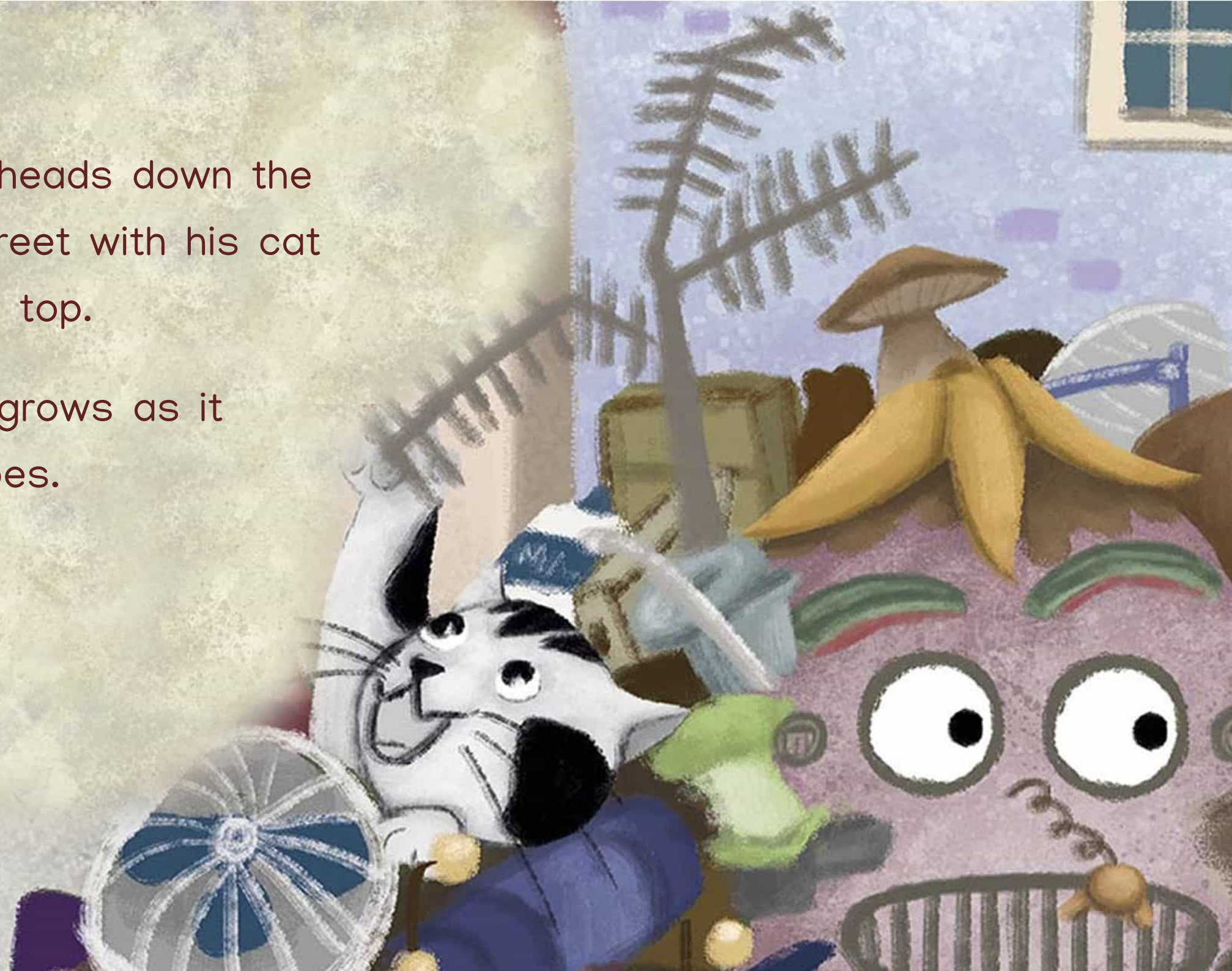
A pile of trash has got

save his cat.

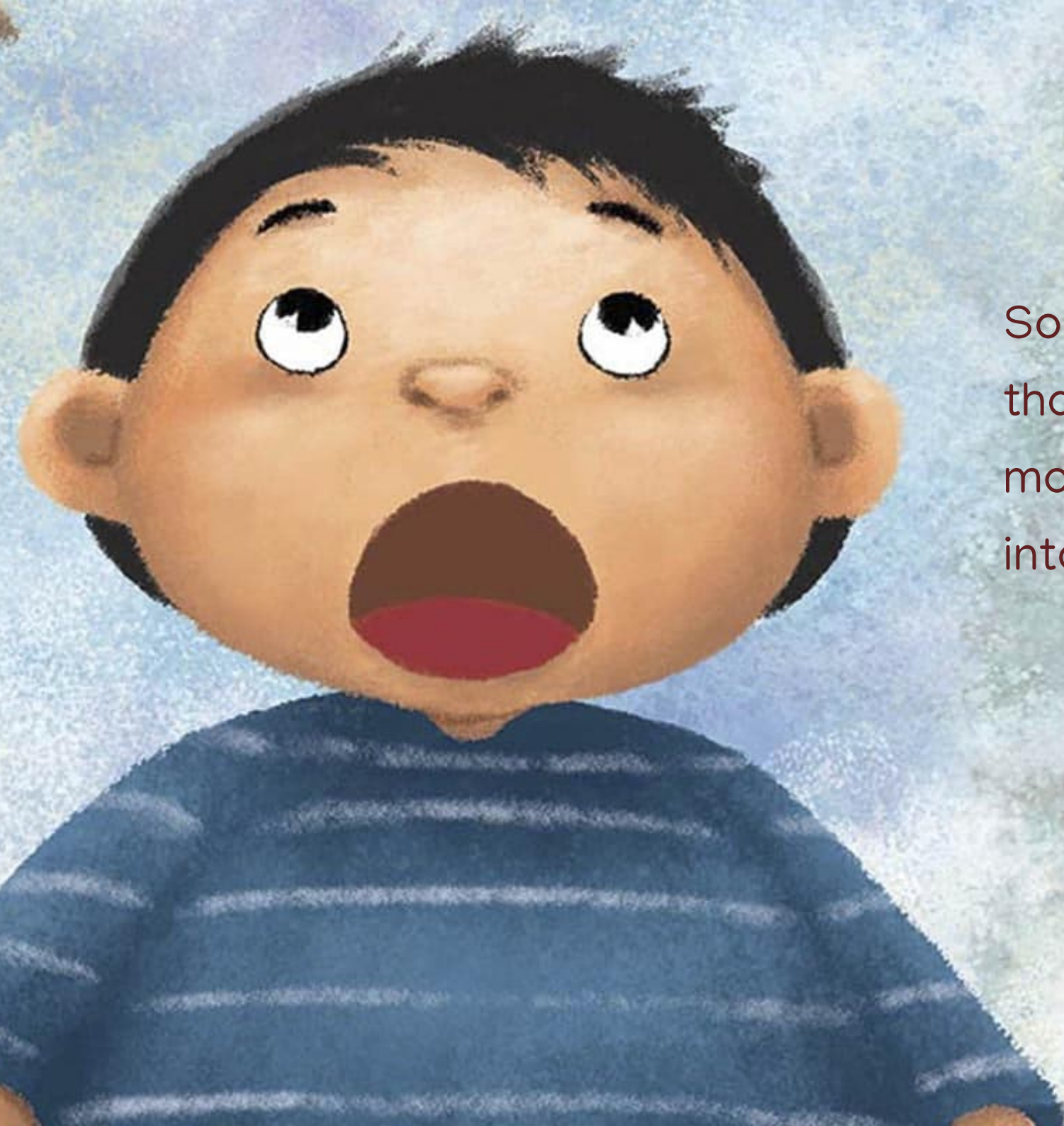






The monster drew in

grew and grew.

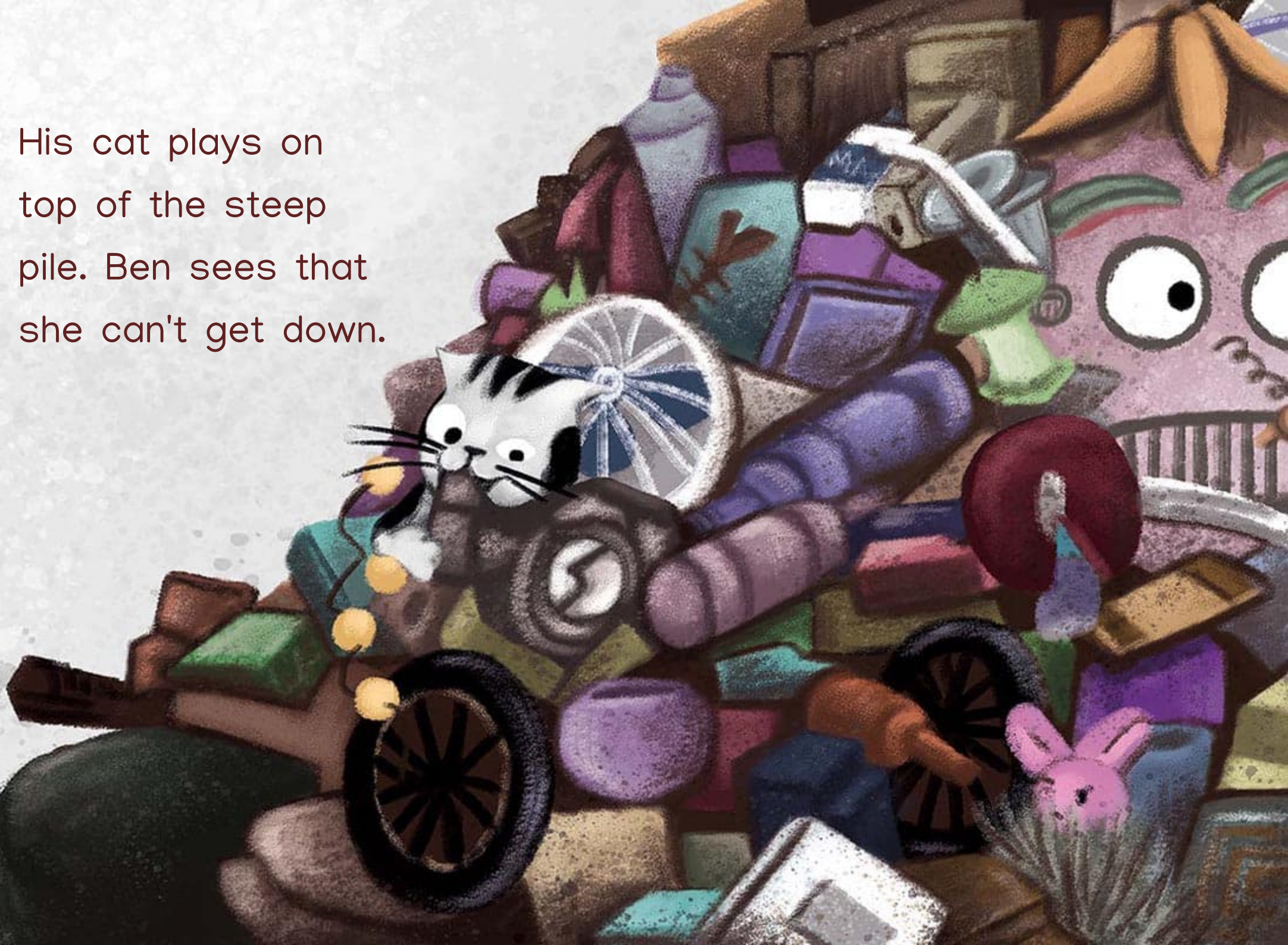




Soon, Ben can see

The cat hops off the pile when Ben calls her.



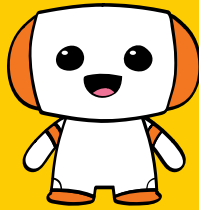


But, Wow!
