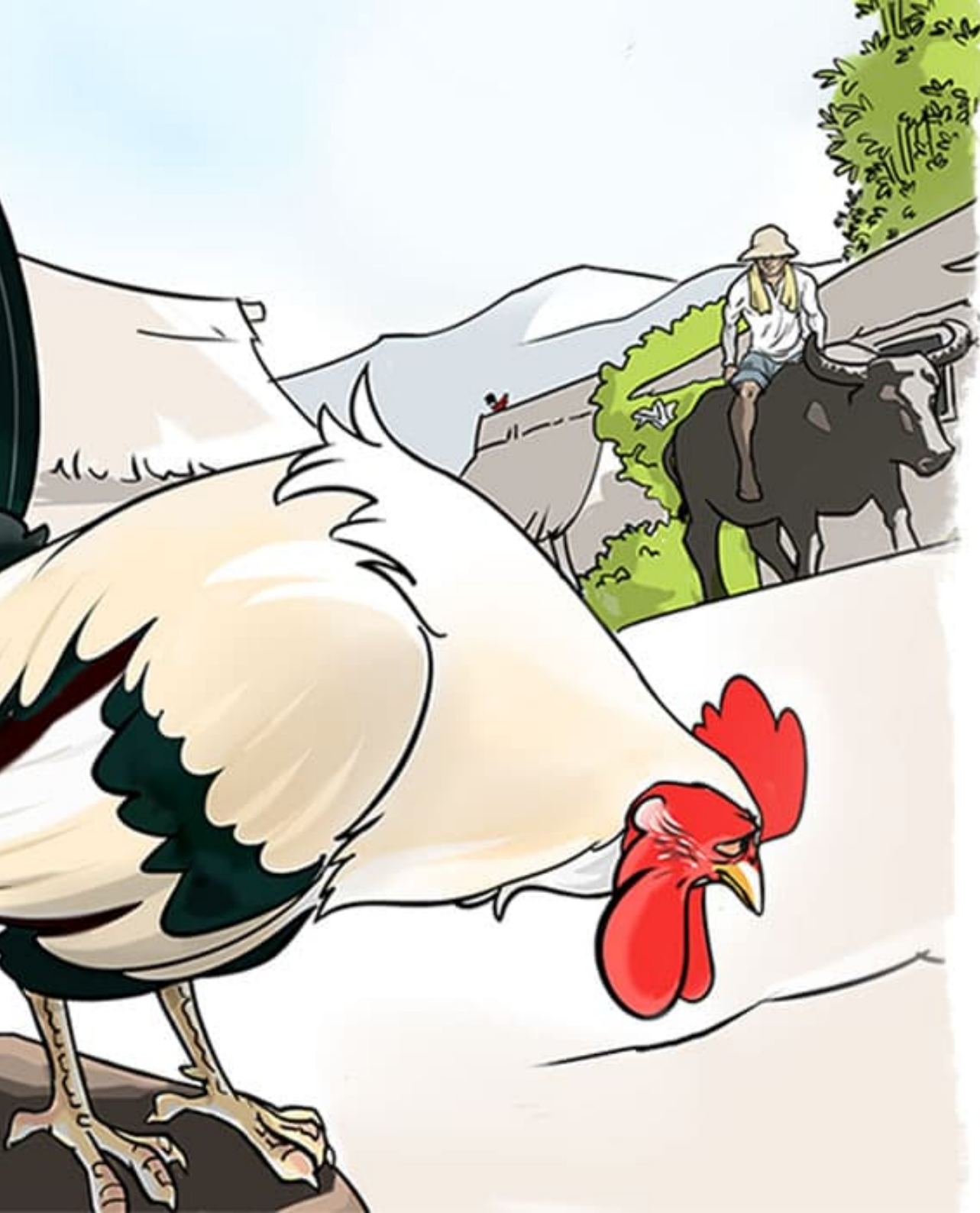


ROOSTER
