some facts.





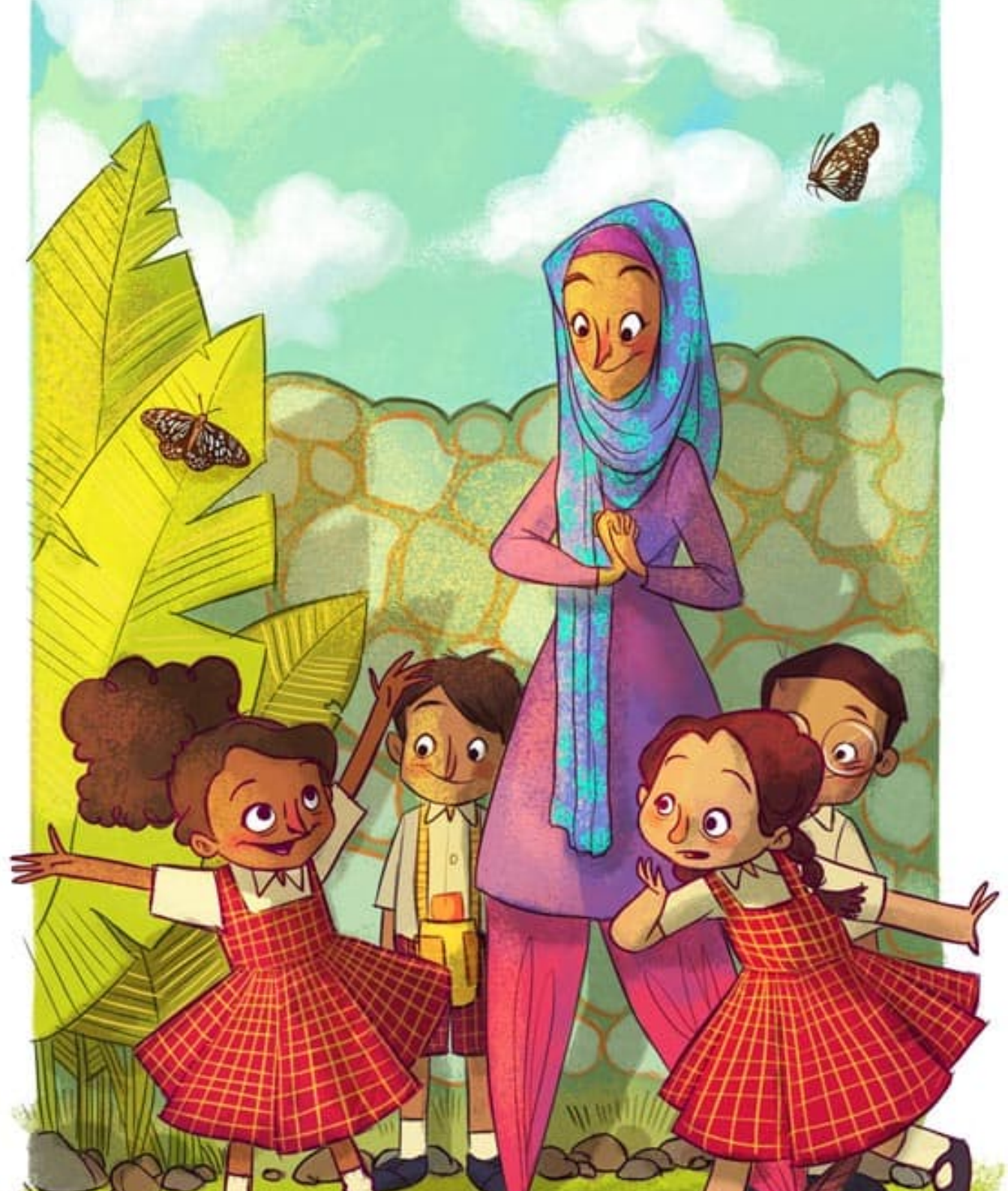
Butterflies have

Diya and Liz spot all of the types of butterflies.



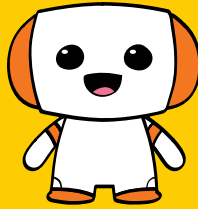


Diya gets top marks for her work.
