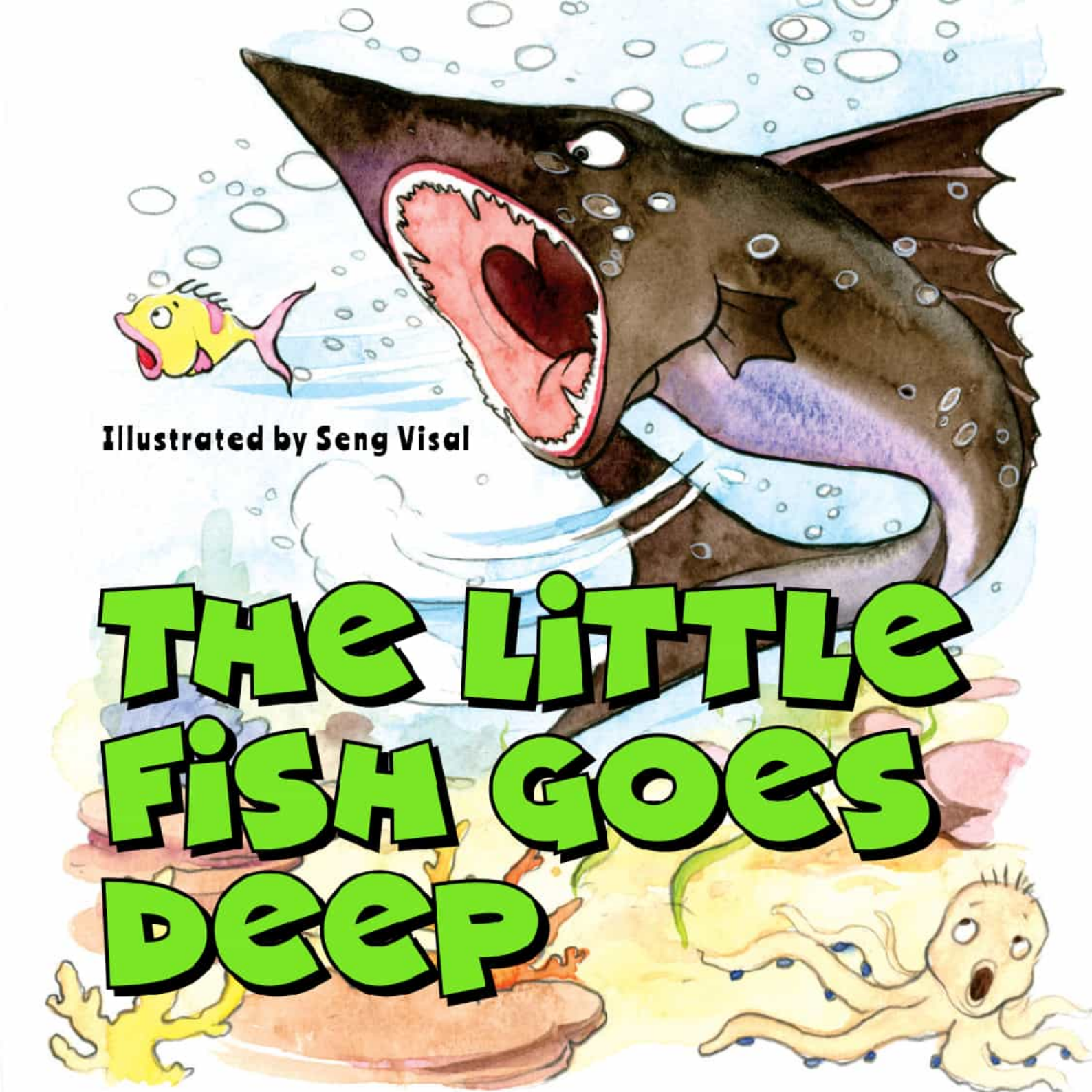

'Now you will be my breakfast!'

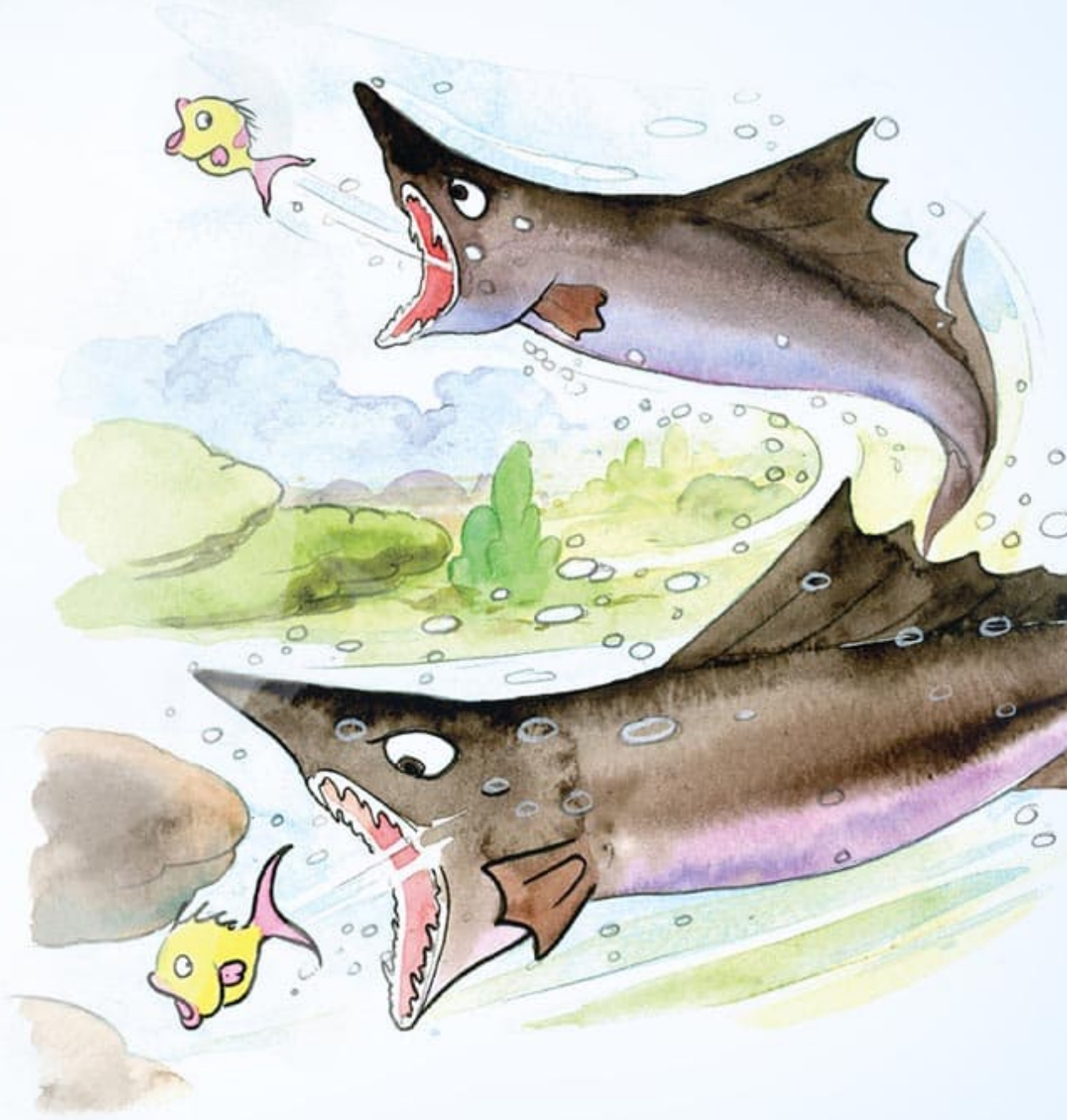


The little fish swam as fast as he could.
