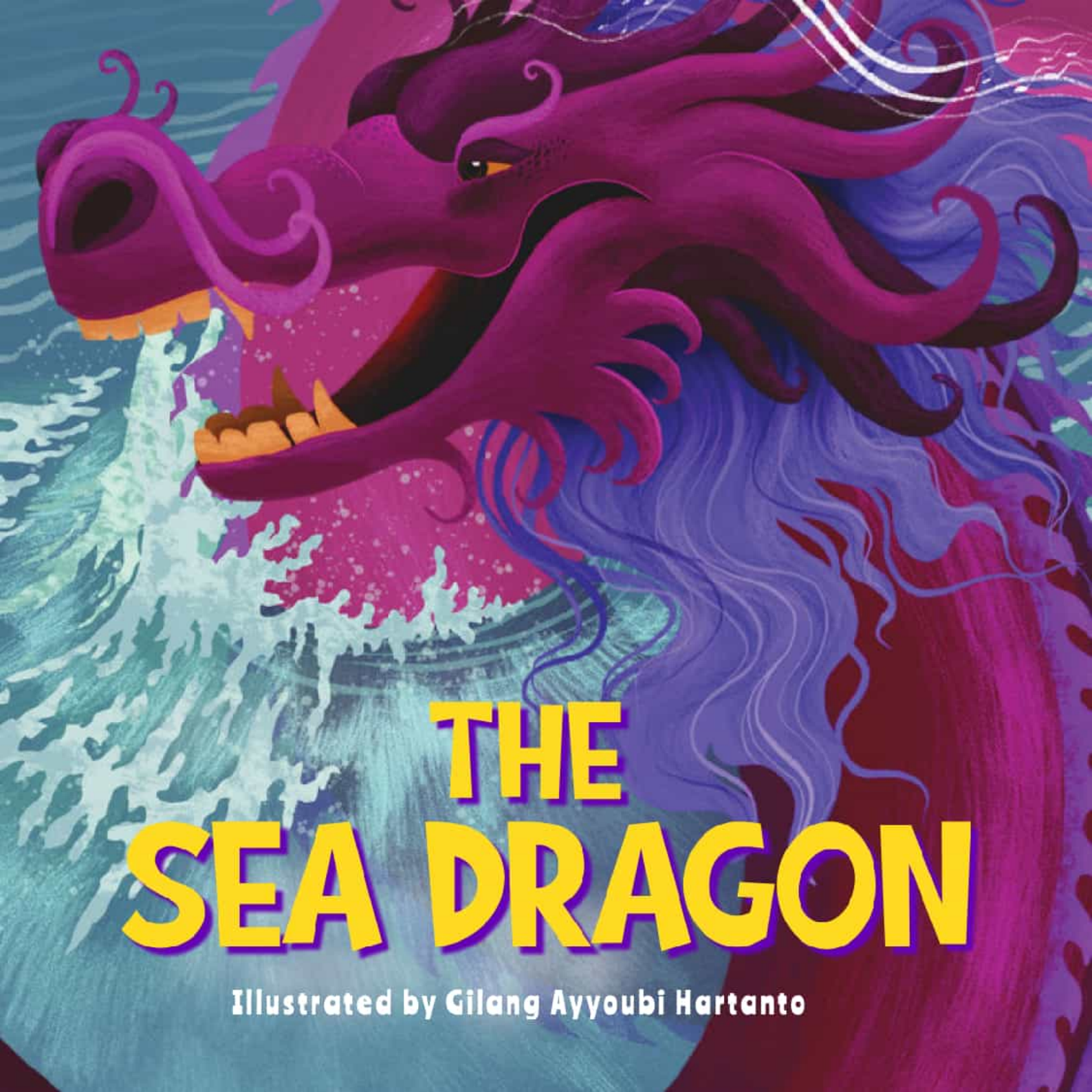

He starts to play.





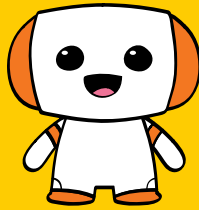
The dragon makes a small splash.
