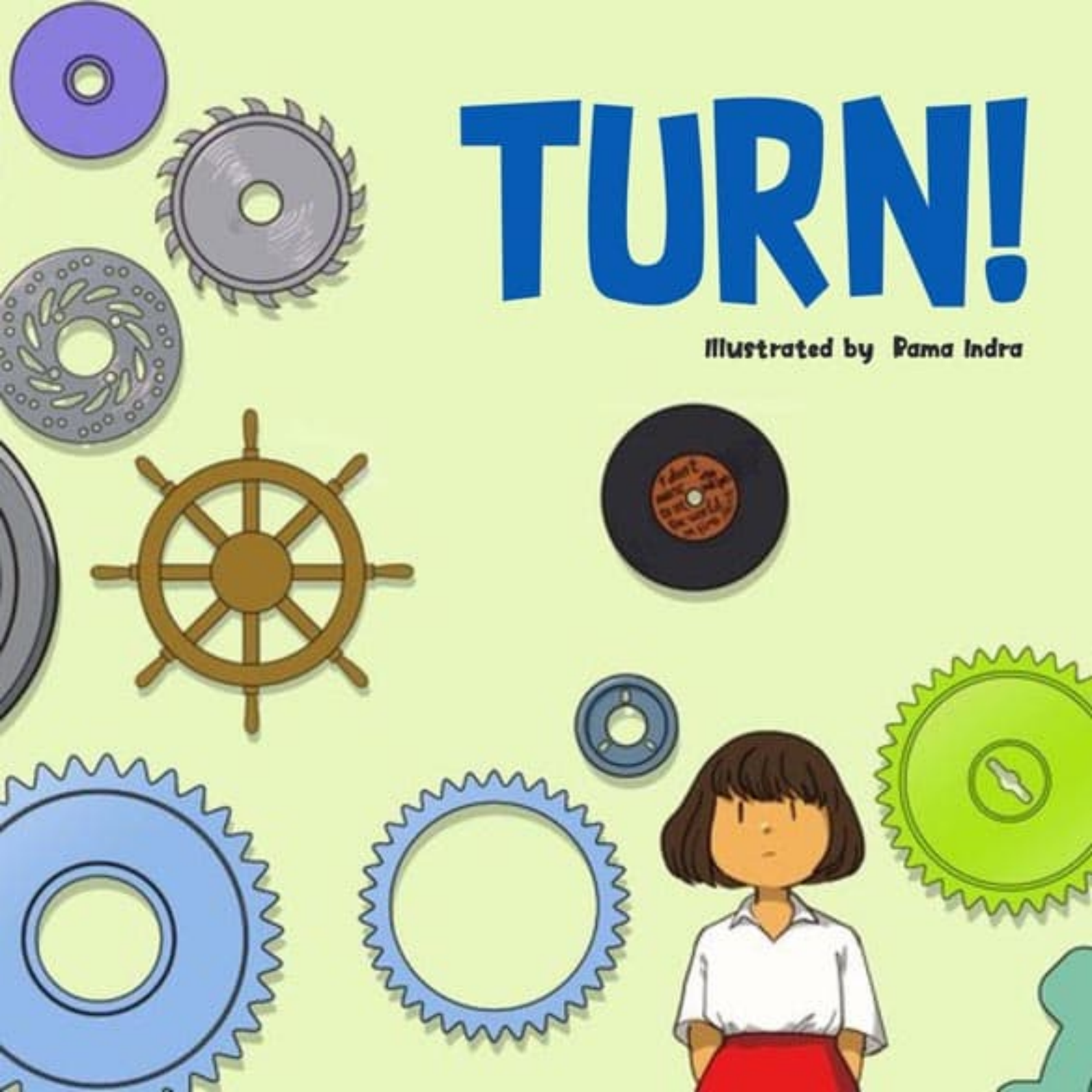

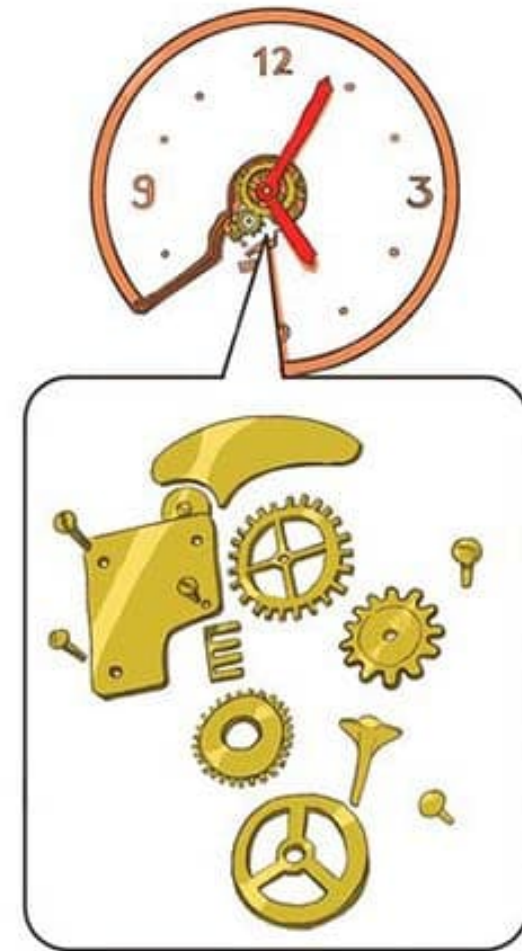
Wheels are on a lot of things.

move.

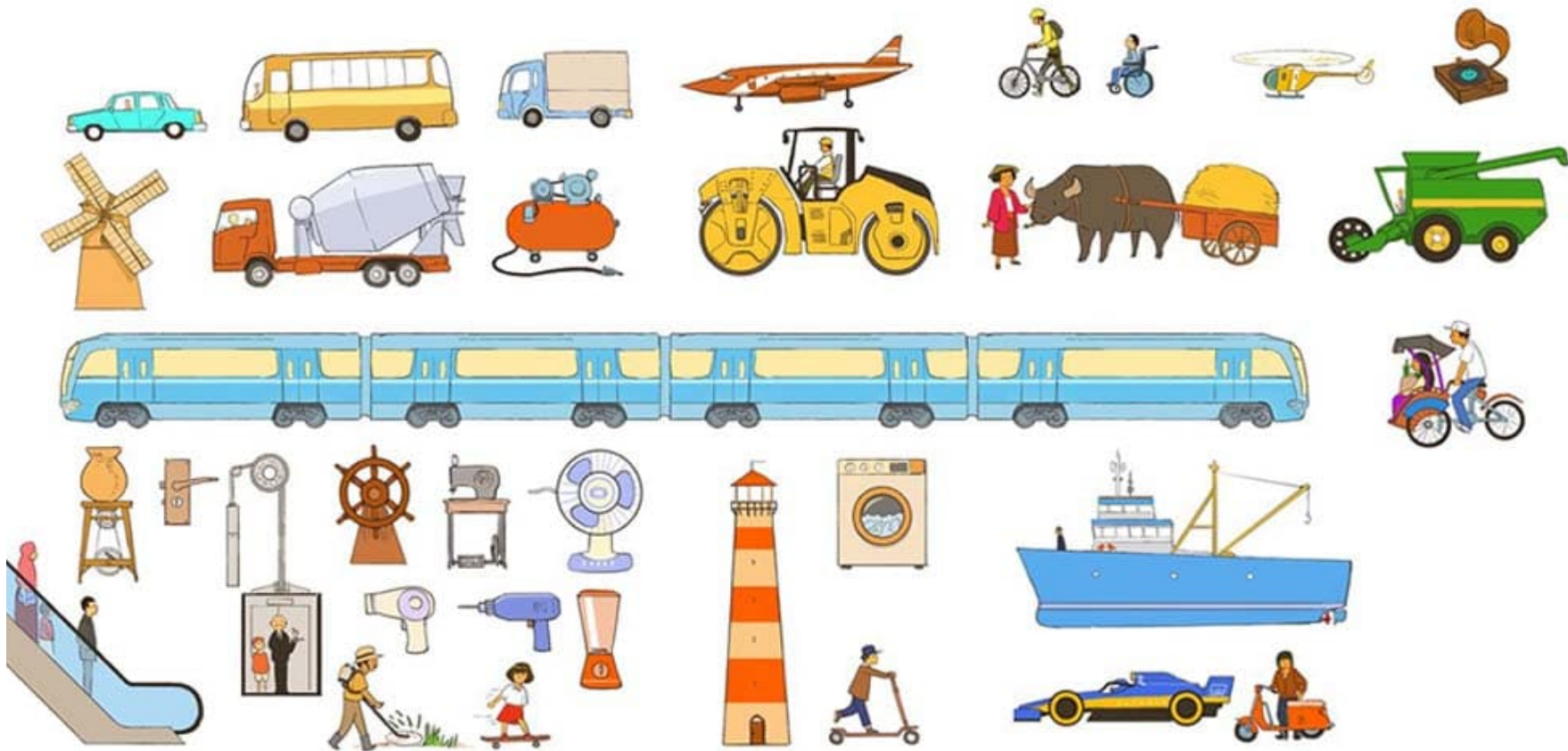


Wheels on a farm.

all be so bad.

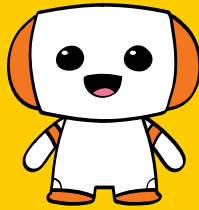


With no wheels, the
