The zoo! I've always wanted to go there!




But soon I realize that Jane is not behind me.

I start barking, excited to see her at last.




Oops! This isn't Jane, or Jane's hair!

Where can Jane be?




I walk a little further and I see a place with lots of trees.

Where can Jane be?


I walk through the crowds of people, trying to see Jane.
